# **▲** Safety Precautions

Please read the safety warnings and cautions provided in this guide to ensure that you use your machine safely. Do not attempt to use the machine in any way not described in this guide.

## **▲** Warning

You may cause an electric shock/fire or damage the machine if you ignore any of these safety precautions.

Location	Do not place the machine close to flammable solvents such as alcohol or thinners. If flammable substances come into contact with electrical parts inside the machine, it may result in fire or electrical shock.		
Power supply	Never attempt to plug or unplug the machine from the power supply when your hands are wet. This may result in electrical shock.		
	Always push the plug all the way into the power outlet. If the prongs of the power plug come into contact with metal objects, it may result in fire or electrical shock.		
	Never damage, modify, stretch or excessively bend or twist the power cord. Do not place heavy objects on the power cord. These actions may cause electrical damage and result in fire or electrical shock.		
	Never plug the machine into a power socket that is shared with other equipment (extension lead/cord, 2- or 3-way adapter, etc.). This may result in fire or electrical shock.		
	Plug the machine into a standard 100-240 V AC, 50/60 Hz (depending on your local electrical requirements), two-prong* grounded outlet. Operate the machine only from the type of power source indicated on the machine's label or a fire, electrical shock, or malfunction may occur. If you are unsure of the type of power available, consult your loca power company.		
	* The shape of the plug and outlet may vary depending on the country of purchase.		
	Do not allow the power cord to be near objects that emit heat. The outer cover of the power cord may melt resulting in fire or electrical shock.		
	Never use the machine if the power cord is bundled or knotted. Knots in the cord may result in fire or electrical shock.		
	If you detect smoke, unusual smells or strange noises around the machine, immediately unplug the machine at the power supply and contact your local authorized Canon dealer o the Canon help line.		
	Using the machine in such conditions may result in fire or electrical shock.		
	Periodically, unplug the machine and use a dry cloth to wipe off any dust or dirt collected on the plug and the power outlet.		
	If the machine is placed at a location exposed to a lot of dust, smoke, or high humidity, the dust collected on the plug absorbs moisture and may cause insulation failure and fire.		
Maintenance	Do not service the machine yourself except as specifically described in this guide. If furthe servicing is required, contact your local authorized Canon dealer or the Canon help line.		
	When storing the machine, choose a location where the machine is not exposed to dust. Dust accumulation may prevent the machine from operating properly.		
	Use a damp cloth to clean the machine. Never use flammable solvents such as alcohol, benzene or thinners. If flammable solvents come in contact with electrical components inside the machine, it could cause a fire or electrical shock.		
	Always turn OFF the power and unplug the machine from the power outlet before cleaning the machine.		
	If you leave ON or accidentally switch the machine ON while cleaning it, it may result in injury or damage the machine.		

Handling	Do not attempt to disassemble or modify the machine. There are no user serviceable parts inside the machine.
	The machine contains high-voltage components. Never attempt any maintenance procedure not described in this guide. Incorrect maintenance procedures may damage the machine, or cause a fire or electrical shock.
	Do not drop paper clips, staples, or other metal objects inside the machine. Also do not spill water, liquid, or flammable substances inside the machine. If these items come into contact with high-voltage parts inside the machine, it may result in fire or electrical shock. If these items are dropped or spilled in the machine, turn OFF the power and unplug the power cord immediately with dry hands. Then contact your local authorized Canon dealer or the Canon help line.
	Do not use flammable sprays near the machine.
	This could cause a fire or electrical shock if the spray comes into contact with electrical components inside the machine.
	There are high-voltage components inside the machine. If you are looking inside the machine to clear paper jams etc., do not allow metal objects such as jewelry to come into contact with the inside of the machine. Contact may result in burns or electrical shock.
Others	When setting the machine near electric products with fluorescent lighting, separate the machine at least 5.9 inches (15 cm) from electric products equipped with fluorescent lighting. If you place it near to them, the machine may malfunction as a result of the noise emitted by the fluorescent lighting.
	When turning OFF the power, be sure to press [ON/OFF] and confirm that the Alarm Lamp has shut off. If you pull the power plug out of the wall outlet while the Alarm Lamp is on, the FINE Cartridge is not protected, and you may not be able to print later.



You may cause injury or damage the machine if you ignore any of these safety precautions.

Location	Do not block or cover the ventilation port or any openings on the machine with objects, as it may cause the inside of machine to overheat and cause a fire.
	Place the machine on a flat, stable, vibration-free surface that is strong enough to support its weight. If the machine topples over, it may result in injury. (For the weight of the machine, see "Appendix" on page 108.
	Do not use or store the machine outdoors.
	Do not install the machine near devices that contain magnets or generate magnetic fields, such as speakers.
	To ensure proper ventilation, make sure the machine is approximately 4 inches (10 cm) away from walls and other equipment.
	Do not install the machine in a location that is very humid or dusty, in direct sunlight, outdoors, or close to a heating source.
	Installing in such a location may result in fire or electrical shock.
	To avoid the risk of fire or electrical shocks, install the machine in a location with an ambient temperature range of 41°F to 95°F (5°C to 35°C) and humidity of 10% to 90% (condensation free).
	Do not place the machine on a thick rug or carpet.
	If fibers or dust come inside the machine, it could cause a fire.

#### Power supply

Never remove the plug by pulling on the cord.

Pulling on the power cord may damage the cord and cause a fire or electrical shock.

When turning OFF the power, be sure to press [ON/OFF] or unplug the machine.

However, if the machine is unplugged during printing, the FINE Cartridge is not protected with the cap that prevents the ink from drying. This may affect the print quality of the machine when printing later.

During electrical storms, turn OFF the power and disconnect the power cord from the power outlet.

Do not use an extension cord as this may result in fire or electrical shock.

Ensure that the area around the power outlet is kept clear at all times so you can easily unplug the power cord if necessary. Otherwise you will be unable to disconnect the power plug in case of an emergency, and it may result in fire or electrical shock.

Never use a power supply source other than the one rated for the machine in the country where you purchased the machine as it may result in fire or electrical shock.

The operating requirement of this machine is as follows:

100-240 V AC, 50/60 Hz (depending on local electrical requirements)

Do not plug the machine into the same circuit as appliances such as an air conditioner, television, or copier. These devices generate electrical noise which may interfere with your machine's operation.

Whenever you turn OFF the power and unplug the machine, wait at least five seconds before you plug it in again.

Use only the power cord that came with the machine. Using a different power cord may cause electric leakage or damage to the machine.

Turn OFF the power and unplug the machine in the following conditions:

- When the power cord or plug is damaged or frayed.
- If liquid has spilled into the machine.
- If the machine has been exposed to rain or water.
- If the machine does not operate normally when you have followed the instructions in the guides included with your machine.
- If the machine does not operate normally when you have followed the instructions provided in "Troubleshooting" on page 85.
- If the machine has been dropped or damaged.
- If the machine exhibits a distinct change in performance, indicating a need for servicing.

Turn OFF the power and disconnect the power cord if the machine will not be used for a long period such as during holidays.


The socket-outlet shall be installed near the equipment and shall be easily accessible.

#### Handling

Close the Document Cover gently to avoid catching your hand. Failing to do so may result in personal injury.



Do not press down hard on the Document Cover when using the Platen Glass to scan thick books. This may damage the Platen Glass and Document Cover, and/or result in personal injury.



Do not place the following objects on top of the machine. If such objects come into contact with internal electrical components, the machine may short-circuit, resulting in fire or electrical shock.

- Metal objects such as jewelry and watches
- Containers of water or other liquids such as glasses, vases, or pot plants

If water does spill inside the machine, turn OFF the power immediately by pressing the [ON/OFF], and disconnect the power cord. Then, contact your local authorized Canon dealer or the Canon help line.

Do not touch the high-voltage electrical parts as this may result in electrical shock.

Do not place heavy objects on top of the machine as these may topple over and result in injury.


When removing paper jammed in the machine, be careful not to get ink on your hands or clothing. If ink gets on your hands or clothing, wash them soon in running water. If you use hot water, the ink may adhere and become difficult to remove.

After printing, do not touch the electrical contacts of the FINE Cartridge. They will be hot and may result in burns or electrical shock.

Do not subject the machine to strong physical shock or vibration. This can damage the machine's components.

Before moving the machine, turn OFF the power and unplug the machine.

When moving the machine, carry the machine at both ends.



A distinct change in performance may indicate a need for servicing.

Do not insert your hands into the machine while it is printing.

Parts inside the machine are moving and this may result in injury.

Do not turn the machine upside down.

Ink may leak out and stain clothing or the surrounding area.

Adjust only those controls that are covered by the instructions in the guides since improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and require extensive repair by a qualified technician to restore the product to normal operation.

When storing or transporting the machine, do not tilt it, stand it on its side, or turn it upside down. Doing so may cause ink to leak out.

Cartridges)	For safety reasons, store FINE Cartridges (Ink Cartridges) out of the reach of small children.  If a child ingests any ink, consult a doctor immediately.


# **Before Printing**

# **Machine Parts And Their Functions**

This section provides the name and location of the main components of this machine, and also describes their functions.


#### Machine

#### Exterior



- (1) Document Cover Covers the Platen Glass. Open this cover when loading a document on the Platen Glass.
- (2) Paper Support Supports paper loaded in the Auto Sheet Feeder. Open it before loading paper.
- (3) Paper Support Extension Supports paper loaded in the Auto Sheet Feeder. Pull it out before loading paper.
- (4) Paper Guide When loading paper, ensure the left edge of the paper just touches this guide.
- (5) Auto Sheet Feeder Load paper here. Paper feeds automatically, one sheet at a time.
- (6) Paper Output Tray Printouts are output to this tray. Open the tray before you start copying or printing. When not being used, keep it closed in the machine.
- (7) Direct Print Port Used to connect a PictBridge-compliant device to the machine when printing images directly from the device.
- (8) Platen Glass
  Used to load a document to be processed.
- (9) Operation Panel Displays the operational status of the machine. It is also used to change or check the settings of each function. For details, see page 12.

#### Rear view and interior



- (10) FINE Cartridge Holder
  Install the FINE Cartridges here.
- (11) FINE Cartridges (Ink Cartridges)

Replaceable cartridge that comprises an integrated Print Head and ink tank.

FINE Cartridges are available in two types, Color (on the right) and Black (on the left).

(12) Scanning Unit
Used to scan a document.

(13) Card Slots (MP180)

Insert a memory card or card adapter containing a memory card into these slots for photo printing. The machine is equipped with two kinds of Card Slot.

- (14) Access Lamp (MP180)
  - Lights when a memory card is inserted into the Card Slots. This lamp flashes while the machine is reading data from the memory card.
- (15) Scanning Unit Support
  Used to hold the Scanning Unit being opened.
- (16) Paper Thickness Lever

Used to adjust the gap between the FINE Cartridge and surface of the printing paper. Move the lever to the correct position for the media being used.

- (17) Power Connector
  - Used to connect the power cord to the machine.
- (18) USB Port

Used to connect a computer to the machine when printing from or scanning to the computer.


**▲** Important

While the machine is printing from or scanning images to the computer, or the computer is in the sleep mode or standby mode, do not disconnect and connect the USB cable.

#### ■ Operation Panel


This section describes the buttons on the Operation Panel, and their functions and locations.

#### MP180



- (1) [Photo Index Sheet] Button Switches the machine to Photo Index Sheet mode.
- (2) [COPY] Button Switches the machine to copy mode.
- (3) [SCAN] Button Switches the machine to scan mode. In scan mode, the machine scans a document to your computer according to the settings selected. To use this button, the machine must be connected to a computer.
- (4) [MEMORY CARD] Button Switches the machine to memory card mode.
- (5) LCD (Liquid Crystal Display) Displays messages, menu selections, and the operational status.
- (6) [Black] Button Starts black & white copying.
- (7) [Color] Button Starts color copying.
- (8) [Stop/Reset] Button Cancels operations and returns the machine to standby mode.
- (9) [ON/OFF] Button Turns the machine ON and OFF. Before turning ON the machine, make sure the Document Cover is closed.
- (10) Alarm Lamp
  Lights if an error occurs, or when the paper or ink runs out.
- (11) [Menu] Button Accesses the settings to customize operation of your machine.
- (12) [◄ (-)] and [►(+)] Buttons Scroll through menu selections, and increase or decrease the number of copies or the image file number.
- (13) [OK] Button Selects or confirms settings. Also, press this button to return to standby mode after correcting paper jams and other errors that interrupt the printing.
- (14) [Back] Button Allows you to return to the pervious screen.

#### **MP160**




- (1) [ (Maintenance)] Button
  Accesses the Maintenance menu.
- (2) [Fit to Page] Button Enables/disables the Fit-to-Page copying.
- (3) Fit-to-Page Lamp
  Lights when Fit-to-Page copying is enabled.
- (4) [SCAN] Button Opens the MP Navigator to scan a document to your computer according to the settings selected. To use this button, the machine must be connected to a computer.
- (5) Alarm Lamp Lights if an error occurs, or when the paper or ink runs out.
- (6) LED (Light Emitting Diode) Displays the number of copies, Maintenance menu selections or the operational status.
- (7) [Black] Button\* Starts black & white copying. Also, press this button to confirm settings or operations.
- (8) [Color] Button\* Starts color copying. Also, press this button to confirm settings or operations.
- (9) [Stop/Reset] Button Cancels operations and returns the machine to standby mode.
- (10) [ON/OFF] Button Turns the machine ON and OFF. Before turning ON the machine, make sure the Document Cover is closed.
- (11) Black/Color Ink Lamp Lights when a Black/Color FINE Cartridge is empty.
- (12) Paper Lamp
  Displays the selected paper size and type for copying.
- (13) [Paper] Button
  Switches the paper size and type for copying.
- (14) [+] Button
  Increases the number of copies.
- \* In the software applications or manuals, [Black] and/or [Color] buttons are collectively called "[Start]" or "[OK]".

# **Turning The Machine ON/OFF**

1 Press [ON/OFF] to turn the machine ON and OFF. Before turning ON the machine, make sure the Document Cover is closed.



## ▲ Important

- Always press [ON/OFF] before disconnecting the power cord. This
  ensures the FINE Cartridge is covered to prevent it from drying out.
- If the machine is not used for an extended period of time, we recommend making black & white and color prints/copies or performing FINE Cartridge cleaning about once every month to prevent degradation of the FINE Cartridge. (See page 78)
- The FINE Cartridge has many nozzles in order to produce highdefinition prints. In the same way that the tip of a felt-tip or marker pen will naturally dry out over time and become unusable even with the cap in place, the nozzles might become clogged. Periodically printing or performing FINE Cartridge cleaning can help to prevent this kind of clogging.

## ■ Note

- The power cannot be turned OFF with [ON/OFF] while the machine is operating.
- Your machine performs a FINE Cartridge cleaning every time you plug in the machine. This ensures optimum print quality but also consumes a small amount of ink during the cleaning process. We recommend turning OFF the power with [ON/OFF].

# **Setting Documents**

#### Document Requirements

The documents you load on the Platen Glass for copying or scanning must meet these requirements:

Document Type	<ul> <li>All types of paper documents</li> <li>Photographs</li> <li>Books, catalogs or magazines</li> </ul>
Size (W x L)	• Max. 8 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> in. x 11 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>4</sub> in. (216 mm x 297 mm)
Thickness	• Max. <sup>3</sup> / <sub>4</sub> in. (20 mm)

#### Loading Documents

To copy or scan a document, set it on the Platen Glass.

- Make sure any glue, ink, or correction fluid on the document is completely dry before loading.
- **1** Lift the Document Cover.
- 2 Load your document.
  - Place your document face down on the Platen Glass.
  - Align the upper left corner of your document with the alignment mark on the lower right corner of the Platen Glass.



# **▲** Important

- Do not place any objects weighing more than 4.4 lb / 2 kg on the Platen Glass.
- Do not press or put weight on the original with pressure exceeding 4.4
   lb / 2 kg.

Doing so may cause the scanner to malfunction or the Platen Glass to break.

Note

The machine cannot scan the area within approximately 1/16 in. (2 mm) of the front and right edges of the Platen Glass.

# **3** Gently close the Document Cover.



Thick documents (Max. 3/4 in./20 mm), such as books, can also be scanned.



# **General Paper Guidelines**

#### ■ Paper Types You Cannot Use

Do not use:

- Folded, creased, curled, or wrinkled paper
- Envelopes with double flaps, or with pressure seals
- Moist paper
- Paper with holes (e.g. punched holes)
- Very thin paper (less than 17 lb. or 64 g/m²)
- Very thick paper (more than 28 lb. or 105 g/m²) other than genuine Canon paper
- Postcards with photographs or stickers adhered to them
- Envelopes made with embossed or treated surfaces

# Handling Paper

- Hold the paper as close as possible to its edges and try not to touch the print surface. The
  print quality will deteriorate if the print surface is damaged or becomes dirty.
- Do not touch the print surface until the ink has dried.
- Some paper may curl and the print surface may smudge if you have used a large amount of ink for printing. Paper that tends to curl is not recommended for printing photographs or graphics. Use it for printing mainly text.
- If the paper is curled, uncurl (flatten) it before printing.
- Place the paper back into its packet when not using it, and store out of direct sunlight in a
  place where the temperature and humidity are low.
- If the printed area is traced with a highlight pen or paint-stick or stained with water or sweat, ink may blur.


- Do not touch the print surface until the ink is dry (approx. 30 minutes). Colors in dark images may appear indistinct at first, but will become clearer after approx. 30 minutes.
- Images may smudge if you place them in an album before the ink is completely dry. It is recommended that you allow the ink to dry for 24 hours.
- Do not attempt to dry the ink with a hair dryer or by exposing printouts to direct sunlight.
- Do not store or display printouts in hot, damp, or humid conditions. Never expose them to heat or direct sunlight.
- Store printouts in photo albums, photo frames, or presentation binders to protect them from direct exposure to air or sunlight.
- Do not mount printouts in an adhesive-type album as you may not be able to remove them.
- Be aware that some types of clear plastic folders and albums may cause the edges of the paper to turn yellow.

## ■ Adjusting Image Quality

You can adjust the image quality according to the document to be copied.

#### Follow this procedure:

- 1 Press [COPY].
- 2 Press [Menu] repeatedly until <IMAGE QUALITY> appears.

3 Use [◀] or [▶] to select the image quality.

<STANDARD>: Suitable for text-only documents.

<HIGH>: Suitable for photographs.

<FAST>: Suitable for high speed copying at a lower image quality.

#### Adjusting Exposure (Intensity)

Exposure (intensity) is the degree of difference between light and dark. Increasing the exposure setting further blackens dark areas and whitens bright areas. Conversely, decreasing the exposure setting reduces the difference between bright and dark areas. You can adjust the exposure between nine gradations.

- 2 Press [Menu] repeatedly until <INTENSITY> appears.

## Reducing Or Enlarging A Copy

You can reduce or enlarge copies using three different methods:

Preset copy ratios You can select one of the preset ratios to reduce or enlarge copies.

Custom copy ratios You can specify the copy ratio as a percentage to reduce or enlarge (Zoom) copies.

Automatic ratios The machine automatically reduces or enlarges the image to fit the paper (Fit to Page) size.

The following sections describe how to use these methods.

#### Using Preset Copy Ratios

Preset copy ratios are convenient when changing between standard paper sizes, for example, reducing A4 to letter size, or enlarging 4" x 6" to letter size.

With this machine, you can easily print photographs using a Photo Index Sheet, by filling in the appropriate circles to select print options and photographs you want to print. Simply scanning a Photo Index Sheet prints the selected photographs according to the selections you have made.

1 Turn ON the machine, and load A4- or Letter- sized paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder.

Use completely white plain paper when printing a Photo Index Sheet.

You can print all photos saved on a memory card.

All photos saved on the memory card will be printed.

## ■ Specifying The Printing Data

You can specify how many copies to print for each photo.

- **3** Press [MEMORY CARD] and then press [Menu].

- **5** Use [ or [ ] to select the photo number to print, then press [OK]. You can select the multiple photo numbers.




- 6 Use [◀] or [▶] to specify the number of copies to print, then press [OK].

The specified number of copies for each photo will be printed.

## ■ Printing A Range Of Photos

You can print a range of photos in sequence on a memory card. To select the photos to print, first print the index and note the photo numbers assigned to them. You can also print a range of photos according to the shooting dates of photos you select. To print an index, see "Print Index" on page 43.

- 1 Turn ON the machine and load the paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder.
- 2 Insert the memory card into the Card Slot. See "Inserting A Memory Card" on page 37.
- **3** Press [MEMORY CARD] and then press [Menu].
- **4** Use [**◄**] or [**▶**] to select <SELECT RANGE>, then press [OK].
- **5** Use [ or [ ] to select < PHOTO NO. > or < DATE >, then press [OK].



- 6 Use [◀] or [▶] to select the earliest photo number or shooting date to print, then press [OK].
- 7 Use [◀] or [▶] to select the latest photo number or shooting date to print, then press [OK].

The specified photos are printed.

## ■ Printing On Stickers - Sticker Print

You can print your favorite photos on Canon sticker paper.

  - Note You can load only one sheet of stickers at a time.
- 2 Insert the memory card into the Card Slot. See "Inserting A Memory Card" on page 37.

  - **Note** You can only print in 4 x 4 layout though other layouts appear on the LCD.
- **8** Press [Color].

The specified number of copies are printed.

You cannot specify the paper size, paper type, bordered or borderless printing when using this function.

#### ■ DPOF Print

If DPOF (Digital Print Order Format) settings are made on the camera, photos are printed automatically according to those settings.

#### ■ Note

• This machine allows you to make the following DPOF settings:

#### Image format:

CIFF, JFIF, and Exif

#### Print type - Standard:

The photos for which you specified "Standard" using the DPOF function are printed.

#### Print type - Index:

The photos for which you specified "Index" using the DPOF function are printed according to the index print layout.

#### **Photos to Print:**

Only the photos specified using the DPOF function are printed (photos cannot be specified on the Operation Panel).

#### Copies:

Photos are printed according to the numbers of copies specified using the DPOF function (numbers of copies cannot be specified on the Operation Panel).

Other functions (addition of comments, trimming/rotation, etc.) are not supported.

- Photos are automatically scaled according to the paper size. The upper, lower, left, and/or right portion(s) of the photo may be cropped depending on the size of the paper you use.
- The shooting date format is as specified in the DPOF setting from DPOF printing.
- 1 Turn ON the machine and load the paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder.
- 2 Insert the memory card containing the DPOF information into the Card Slot. See "Inserting A Memory Card" on page 37.
- **3** Press [MEMORY CARD] and then press [Menu].

Selects bordered or borderless print: ON/OFF

#### ■ PRINT DATE

Selects whether to print the shooting date or not: ON/OFF

#### **■ FILE NO. PRINT**

Selects whether to print the file number or not: ON/OFF

#### ■ IMAGE ENHANCEMENT

Selects whether to optimize photos with the functions below or not: SKIP/SET

#### VIVID

Makes green and blue more lively: ON/OFF

#### POP (Photo Optimizer PRO)

Automatically optimizes brightness and tone of a photo: ON/OFF

#### REMOVE NOISE

Reduces the noise on blue areas like the sky as well as on black areas: ON/OFF

#### FACE BRIGHT

Brightens a darkened face on the photo taken against the light: ON/OFF

# **Setting Up The Card Slot As The Memory Card Drive Of The Computer**



Connecting the machine to a computer results in the memory card drive (removable hard disk) being displayed under [My Computer].



When a memory card is already inserted, connecting the machine to a computer results in the memory card drive (removable hard disk) being displayed on the desktop.

Inserting a memory card into the machine and then opening the [Removable Disk] on your computer enables you to view the photos stored on the card. Furthermore, you can copy the files to your hard disk in the same way as any regular hard disk drive, and by changing the write protection setting, you can copy files from your hard disk onto a memory card.

# ▲ Important

- When the write protection is disabled on the machine, neither printing nor maintenance can be done. After using the card slot as the memory card drive for your computer, be sure to enable the write protection again. For details, see page 65.
- If you used the Card Slot as the memory card drive of the computer, you need to do a "safe removal" operation on your computer before physically removing the memory card from your machine.

#### Windows

Right-click the removable disk icon and click [Eject]. If [Eject] is not displayed on the screen, confirm that the Access Lamp is not flashing and remove the memory card.



Drag the icon into the Trash.

# ■ Enabling Writing Of Data To Memory Cards

- 1 Press [MEMORY CARD].
  - Make sure no memory card is inserted in the Card Slots.
- 2 Press [Menu] repeatedly until <SYSTEM SETTINGS> appears.
- **4** Use [**◄**] or [**▶**] to select <READ-ONLY MODE>, then press [OK].
- **5** Use [**d**] or [**b**] to select ON or OFF, then press [OK].

ON: The Card Slot is used only for reading. Be sure to select this mode when printing

photos from a memory card.

OFF: The Card Slot is used as the memory card drive of the computer. Photo data can

be written into the memory card.

## ▲ Important

 Windows 2000, when the write protection is enabled on the machine: If the computer does not detect that the write protection is enabled, a delayed write error might occur and data could be corrupted when attempting to copy data to a memory card.

 You cannot write to memory cards when the machine is in Memory Card mode.

#### **■ Note**

To change the write protect setting while a card is inserted in the Card Slot, unplug the USB cable before changing the setting, then plug it back in afterwards. The new setting is not applied unless you plug the USB cable back in.





  - (1) Select [Print] from the application software's [File] menu. The [Print] dialog box opens.

    The [Main] tab of the [Preferences] screen is displayed.







- For details about other printer driver functions, click [?] to view the Printer Driver Guide. If the On-screen Manual is not installed, the Printer Driver Guide is not displayed even if [?] is clicked.
- Clicking [Preview] displays a preview screen that allows you to confirm
  the selected printing effects and how your document will look when
  printed. Some applications do not have a preview function.

#### ■ Note

- You can cancel a print job in progress by simply pressing [Stop/Reset] on the machine.
- Double-clicking the name of your machine in the [Printer List] of the [Printer Setup Utility] (When using Mac OS X v.10.2.8, double-clicking the name of your machine in the [Printer List] of the [Print Center]) displays a dialog that prompts you to confirm the status of the print job. To cancel a job in progress, select the desired document, then click [Delete]. To temporarily stop a job in progress, click [Hold]. To stop all the jobs in the list, click [Stop Jobs] (when using Mac OS X v.10.3.x or Mac OS X v.10.2.8, click [Stop Printing]).

# **About Scanning Images**

You can scan images from the machine into a computer, and save them in JPEG, TIFF, PDF, or Bitmap format. Then you can process that data by using the supplied application software to create original images. Furthermore, you can use the supplied OCR (Optical Character Recognition) software to convert scanned paper documents to text data.

#### ■ Before Scanning

Before scanning images, confirm as follows:

- Does the document to be scanned meet the requirements for being set on the Platen Glass?
   For details, see page 15.
- Is the machine connected to your computer correctly?
   Make sure your machine and computer are correctly connected with the USB cable.

# Scanning Methods

#### Scanning Using The MP Navigator

Using the MP Navigator, you can scan, process and save documents to your computer. For details on using the MP Navigator, see the *Scanning Guide*.



On the Windows desktop, double-click the [MP Navigator 3.0] icon to open the MP Navigator.



On the [Go] menu, select [Applications], [Canon Utilities], then double-click the [MP Navigator 3.0] icon to open the MP Navigator.

You can launch the following application software from the MP Navigator.

- Easy-PhotoPrint (Photo Printing)
- ArcSoft PhotoStudio (Photo image editing)
- ScanSoft OmniPage SE (Converting scanned document to text)



- If you performed the [Custom Install] and only installed the MP Driver and MP Navigator, these application software were not installed and thus cannot be launched. To launch any of the above application software from MP Navigator, perform the [Custom Install] once again to install them.
- ScanSoft OmniPage SE does not support Windows 98 first edition.

## ■ Scanning With The Operation Panel Of The Machine

With the operation panel of the machine, you can open the MP Navigator and change the settings for the scanning operations. (See the *Scanning Guide*)

## If you are using Windows XP

The program selection screen is displayed the first time you press [Black] / [Color] (MP180) or [SCAN] (MP160) on the machine. Specify [MP Navigator Ver.3.0] as the application software to use, check [Always use this program for this action], then click [OK]. From the next time, MP Navigator is automatically started.

### When using Mac OS X

For the machine to start scanning when [Black] / [Color] (MP180) or [SCAN] (MP160) is pressed, you need to set MP Navigator as the starting application software in Image Capture under [Applications] of Mac OS X.

▲ Important

Make sure that the MP Navigator is installed and that the Macintosh is connected to the machine before starting up Image Capture.

#### If you are using Macintosh OS X v.10.3.x

Select [Applications] from the [Go] menu, then double-click [Image Capture]. Click [Options] at lower left of the scanner window, select [MP Navigator 3.0] from [Application to launch when scanner button is pressed], then click [OK].

**A** Important

If you select [Preferences] from the [Image Capture] menu, click [Scanner], and mark [Use TWAIN software whenever possible], [Options] is not displayed. In this case, click [Use TWAIN software whenever possible] to uncheck the option, exit the Image Capture, then start it again.

#### If you are using Macintosh OS X v.10.2.8

Select [Applications] from the [Go] menu, then double-click [Image Capture]. Select [Preferences] from the [Image Capture] menu. Select [Others] from [When a scanner button is pressed, open], select [MP Navigator 3.0] from [Applications], then click [Open].

#### MP180

- **1** Load the document on the Platen Glass. (See page 15)
- 2 Press [SCAN].

The machine switches to Scan Mode.

**3** Press [Black] or [Color]. The MP Navigator opens.

#### MP160

- 1 Load the document on the Platen Glass. (See page 15)
- 2 Press [SCAN].

The MP Navigator opens.

**□** Note

# Printing Photographs Directly From A PictBridge-Compliant Device

Connecting a PictBridge-compliant device such as digital camera, camcorder or mobile phone to the machine allows you to print recorded images directly without using a computer.

#### **■ Note**

PictBridge is an industry standard enabling a range of digital photo solutions, including the direct printing of photos from compatible digital still cameras, camcorders or mobile phones without the need to use a computer.

\*Hereafter, digital still cameras, digital video camcorders and mobile phones are collectively called the PictBridge-compliant device.

#### ■ Connecting To A PictBridge-Compliant Device

To connect a PictBridge-compliant device to this machine, use the USB cable supplied with the device.

### **▲** Caution

Do not connect any equipment other than PictBridge-compliant devices to the Direct Print Port of the machine. Doing so may result in an electric shock, fire, or damage to the device.


### **■** Note

- When printing photos with the digital device connected to the machine, it is advisable to use the AC adapter supplied with the device. If you use the device's battery, be sure to it is fully charged.
- Depending on the model or brand of your device, you may have to select a mode for printing photos compliant with "PictBridge" before connecting the device.
- You may also have to turn ON the device or select Play mode manually after connecting the device to the machine. Perform such necessary operations according to the instruction manual supplied with your device.
- When printing from your PC, be sure to unplug the cable connecting the device.
- 1 Turn ON the machine.

  Make sure the device is turned OFF.
- **2** Load the paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder.

## **3** Connect the PictBridge-compliant device to the machine.

- (1) Connect the device to the machine using the USB cable (for connection to a computer) supplied with the device.
- (2) Turn ON and set up the device for direct printing. When the connection between the device and machine has been established, <CAMERA DIRECT> (MP180) or <C> (MP160) appears on the machine.
  - \* The power-on sequence may differ depending on the model or brand of the device.



Following icon will display on the LCD display of the device when the machine is correctly connected.

\* This mark indicates that the product is PictBridge-compatible.

# ■ Confirming Or Changing The Device Settings

To change the paper size or paper type, operate the device to select the PictBridge print setup mode and confirm or change the settings.

The settings below can be changed by pressing [Menu] (MP180) or [Paper] / [Fit to Page] (MP160) when the PictBridge-compliant device is connected.

However, changes can only be made on the properties screen when the corresponding items below are in the "Default setting" (selections based on the machine setting) using the controls of the device.

- Page size
- Media type
- Layout
- Image optimize (MP180)

You can specify these settings on MP180 in the <PICTBRIDGE SET>. (See page 65)

#### About the Settings Explained Below

The settings explained on the following pages cannot be made on some devices. If any setting cannot be made, printing will be based on the specified "Default setting".

The items for which the "Default setting" is set will be printed based on the current machine setting.

Names of settings that are displayed on Canon PictBridge-compliant devices are used in the description given below.

Different names may be displayed on your device depending on the brand or model.

For details, refer to your device's instruction manual.

#### About The Image Data Format For Printing

This machine accepts images\* taken with a camera compatible with the Design rule for Camera File system (DCF) and PNG files.

#### About "Page size" And "Media type"

When you have selected the "Default setting" (selections based on the machine setting), the machine operates based on the "Page size" and the "Media type" settings made using the controls of the machine.

#### ■ Note

- When printing onto Photo Stickers (PS-101) (16-up), use the following settings.
  - 1. Load Photo Stickers (PS-101) in the Auto Sheet Feeder.
  - 2. Select "10 x 15 cm / 4" x 6"" for the "Page size", and "Photo" for the "Media type".
  - 3. Select "N-up" for layout, then select "16".
- Some PictBridge compliant devices display the Layout option; 2-up, 4-up, 9-up, and 16-up. In this case always select "16-up". If there are no options on the PictBridge compliant device that correspond to 2-up, 4-up, 9-up, or 16-up, printing on stickers is not possible.
- When you are using Photo Stickers (PS-101), do not set "Borderless Printing" in "Layout" settings.

#### About "Image optimize"

When "Default setting" (selections based on the machine setting) is selected, the machine operates based on the <IMAGE ENHANCEMENT> settings mode using the controls of the machine (MP180).

If you use a Canon PictBridge-compliant device, you can select "VIVID", "NR", "VIVID+NR" or "FACE".

(Note that these options cannot be selected for some models.)

#### **□** Note

- When "VIVID" is selected, the green and blue portions of photos are printed more vividly.
- When "NR" (Noise Reduction) is selected, noise in blue portions, such as the sky, and dark portions is removed.
- When "VIVID+NR" is selected, functions of both "VIVID" and "NR" are performed.
- When "FACE" is selected, a darkened face on the photo taken against the light is brightened.

#### About "Date/File No. print"

By default, "Off" is selected for this machine.

If you select an image which has had the shooting date embedded in it using a camera with the print mode, select "Off" for this function. If you select "Date", "File No.", or "Both", the date and/or file number will be printed over the embedded date (MP180).

#### ■ Note

- Never disconnect the USB cable during printing.
- When disconnecting the USB cable between the device and machine, follow the instructions given in the instruction manual of the device.
- Controls of the device cannot be used for the following:
  - Print quality setting
  - Machine maintenance

# **Changing The Settings**

- 2 Press [Menu] repeatedly until <SYSTEM SETTINGS> appears.
- **4** Use [**◄**] or [**▶**] to select <EXTENDED AMOUNT>, then press [OK].



- - Note Depending on the functions you use, some setting items cannot be specified in combination.

## **PRINT SETTINGS**

#### QUIET MODE

Use this function if you want to reduce the operation noise, such as when printing at night: ON/ OFF



- The printing speed may be reduced compared to when this setting is set to <OFF>.
- This function may not be so effective depending on the Image Quality setting.
- Certain noise, such as when the machine is preparing for printing, is not reduced.

#### ■ EXTENDED AMOUNT

Selects the amount of image that extends off the paper when printing in borderless: SMALL/LARGE

## PICTBRIDGE SET

#### ■ PAGE SIZE

Selects the paper size: 8.5"x11"/A4/B5/A5/4"x6"/5"x7"/CREDIT CARD SIZE

#### ■ MEDIA TYPE

Selects the paper type: PLAIN PAPER/PHOTO PAPER PRO/PHOTO PAPER PLUS/MATTE PHOTO PAPR/GLOSSY

#### PRINT QLTY

Selects the print quality: STANDARD/HIGH

#### ■ BORDERLESS PRINT

Selects bordered or borderless print: ON/OFF

#### **■ IMAGE ENHANCEMENT**

Selects whether to optimize photos or not: SKIP/SET (VIVID/POP/REMOVE NOISE/FACE BRIGHT) (See page 48)

# **OTHERS**

#### ■ DATE/TIME SETUP

Selects the shooting date format to be printed on photos: YYYY/MM/DD, MM/DD/YYYY, DD/MM/YYYY

#### ■ READ-ONLY MODE

Selects whether to allow data to be written onto memory cards from a computer: ON/OFF

#### ■ LANGUAGE SETTING

Changes the language for LCD messages: ENGLISH/FRENCH/SPANISH/PORTUGUESE/GERMAN/ITALIAN/DUTCH/RUSSIAN/DANISH/NORWEGIAN/FINNISH/SWEDISH/HUNGARIAN/CZECH/SLOVENE/POLISH/JAPANESE

# **RESTORE DEFAULT**

Changes the settings back to the default, except for the language for LCD messages and the position of the FINE Cartridge: YES/NO

# SAVE CONFGURATION

Saves the current media settings for the size, type, quality, magnification, intensity and image optimize: YES/NO

# LOAD CONFGURATION

Loads the saved media settings: YES/NO

# Replacing A FINE Cartridge

If there is no improvement with the quality of printing following such maintenance as FINE Cartridge Cleaning, one of the FINE Cartridges is probably empty. Replace the empty FINE Cartridge with a new one. When replacing a FINE Cartridge, check the model number very carefully.

The machine will not print properly if the wrong FINE Cartridge is used, or installed incorrectly.

# ▲ Important

- To maintain optimal print quality, we recommend that you use Canon brand FINE Cartridge. Replenishing ink only is also not recommended.
- Replace the FINE Cartridge promptly. Do not leave with the FINE Cartridge removed.
- When a FINE Cartridge runs out of ink, replace the FINE Cartridge
  with a new one immediately. If you replace it with the FINE Cartridge
  that has previously been removed, the machine may not print properly
  due to clogged FINE Cartridge nozzles. Furthermore, the Low Ink
  Warning dialog box which advises when to exchange the FINE
  Cartridge will be inaccurate.
- To maintain optimal print quality, use up all the ink in the FINE Cartridge within six months of its first use (We recommend that you note the date that the FINE Cartridge was installed in the machine).
- Color ink consumption may occur even when black-and-white or grayscale printing is specified.

Color ink is consumed during Cartridge cleaning, which is necessary to maintain the machine's capabilities.

#### ■ Knowing When To Replace A FINE Cartridge

It is important to identify the empty Cartridge using the LCD/LED and replace it.

**■** Note

Should missing characters or white streaks appear despite sufficient ink levels, see "When Printing Becomes Faint Or Color Is Incorrect" on page 75.

#### When Ink is Low

<BLACK INK LOW> or <COLOR INK LOW> appears on the LCD (MP180) / the Black/Color Ink Lamp lights (MP160) when ink becomes low. Obtain a replacement tank as soon as possible.

#### When Ink is Empty


<CHECK INK> appears on the LCD (MP180) / <E> and <4> appear alternately on the LED (MP160) when ink becomes empty during printing.

Printing will resume as soon as the FINE Cartridge is replaced and the Scanning Unit is closed.

- Press [Stop/Reset] to cancel the current print job.
- Press [OK] (MP180) / [Black] or [Color] (MP160) to resume printing with an empty FINE Cartridge. When printing is finished, replace the FINE Cartridge immediately. If you continue printing with an empty FINE Cartridge, it will be a cause of trouble.
  - \* Be sure to press [OK] (MP180) / [Black] or [Color] (MP160) with all the FINE Cartridges installed. Printing does not resume if any of the FINE Cartridges are left uninstalled.
  - \* If you continue to print with an empty FINE Cartridge, the ink level will not be detected correctly.

### Checking the lnk Level (MP180)

You can check the current ink level by pressing [COPY], [SCAN] or [MEMORY CARD]. The LCD will display the ink level for a few seconds.



(1) Indicates the remaining ink volume at four different levels.

■ Note

If an error message is displayed on the LCD/LED, a FINE Cartridge error has occurred and the machine cannot continue to print. See "An Error Message Is Displayed On The LCD/LED" on page 86.

# ■ What Is A Low Ink Warning?

The Low Ink Warning is the ink counter calculating the remaining level of ink and advising you that the FINE Cartridges are running out of ink during printing.

The ink counter assumes the ink is full when a new FINE Cartridge is installed, and then starts the remaining level of ink. In this instance, if an old FINE Cartridge is installed, a message that the remaining level of ink cannot be detected appears.

#### ■ Note

#### How to Check the Ink Level



Open the [Printer Properties] dialog box. Click the [Maintenance] tab and then click [View Printer Status].

Canon IJ Status Monitor appears. It also appears automatically during printing.



Open the [Canon IJ Printer Utility] dialog box, and then select [Ink Level Information] from the pop-up menu.

• When the "!" mark appears on the Low Ink Warning





The ink level of the FINE Cartridge showing the "!" mark is low. You should ensure you have a new FINE Cartridge.

#### **■ Note**

#### Setting of FINE Cartridges

If a FINE Cartridge runs out of ink, you can print with either the Color or Black FINE Cartridge only for a while. However the same printing quality cannot be expected, compared to printing with both cartridges.



- 1. Open the [Printer Properties] dialog box.
- 2. Click the [Maintenance] tab and then [Ink Cartridge Settings].
- Select [Color only] when the cartridge runs out of Black ink, or select [Black only] when the cartridge runs out of Color ink, and then click the [OK] button.



- 1. Open [Printer Setup Utility] (or Print Center).
- 2. Double-click the model name from [Name] in the Printer List, and then click [Utility].
- Choose the name of your machine from [Product] and click the [Maintenance] button.
- 4. Choose [Ink Cartridge Settings] from the pull down menu.
- Select [Color only] when the cartridge runs out of Black ink, or select [Black only] when the cartridge runs out of Color ink, and then click the [Apply] button.

The [Black only] setting can be used when you select [Plain Paper] in [Media Type]. In this case the Borderless Printing setting cannot be enabled.

If you select [Color only] or [Black only] when the cartridge runs out of ink, remember to return the [Ink Cartridge Settings] to [Both Black and Color] after replacing with new one.

• When the "?" mark appears on the Low Ink Warning





If you install an old FINE Cartridge, the "?" icon appears for the FINE Cartridge in question. In this case, the remaining level of ink cannot be calculated correctly. We recommend that you replace the FINE Cartridge with a new one.

If you try printing when "?" mark appears, the following message appears and printing stops.





In either case, clicking [OK] cancels the error indication and enables continuation of printing. However, the error detection function is disabled after the error indication is canceled, therefore, Low Ink Warning message does not appear later on. When you install a new FINE Cartridge, the Low Ink Warning is enabled automatically.

# When Printing Becomes Faint Or Color Is Incorrect

When printing becomes faint or colors are incorrect, the FINE Cartridge Nozzles are probably clogged. Follow the procedures below to clean these nozzles.





If the print quality does not improve after a standard FINE Cartridge Cleaning, try FINE Cartridge Deep Cleaning, which is a more powerful cleaning process. FINE Cartridge Deep Cleaning consumes more ink than standard FINE Cartridge Cleaning, so perform this procedure only when necessary.



# **Cleaning Your Machine**


This section describes the necessary cleaning procedures for your machine.

## ▲ Caution

- Be sure to turn OFF the power and disconnect the power cord before cleaning the machine.
- Do not use tissue paper, paper towels, or similar materials for cleaning; they
  can stick to the components or generate static charges. Use a soft cloth to
  avoid scratching the components.
- Never use volatile liquids such as thinners, benzene, acetone, or any other chemical cleaner to clean the machine; these can damage the machine's components.

## ■ Cleaning The Platen Glass And Document Cover

Wipe the Platen Glass (A), and the inner side of the Document Cover (white area) (B) with a clean, soft, lint-free cloth moistened with water. Then wipe with a clean, soft, dry, lint-free cloth making sure not to leave any residue, especially on the Platen Glass. If you have trouble getting the scanning area clean, wipe with diluted mild detergent (for dish washing).



# ■ Cleaning The Exterior

Wipe the machine's exterior with a clean, soft, lint-free damp cloth.

#### Cleaning The Roller

Clean the paper feed rollers if paper is not fed properly. Cleaning the paper feed rollers will wear the rollers, so perform this only when necessary.

#### MP180

- 1 Press [ON/OFF] to turn ON the machine, then remove any paper from the Auto Sheet Feeder.
- 2 Press [Menu] repeatedly until <MAINTENANCE> appears.
- **3** Use [◀] or [▶] to select <ROLLER CLEANING>.
- 4 Press [OK].
- **5** Repeat steps 2 to 4 twice.
- **6** Open the Paper Output Tray.
- **7** Load three or more of A4- or Letter-sized paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder.
- **8** Repeat steps 2 to 4 three times.

  The sheet of paper is automatically fed in and then out of the machine.

## MP160

- 1 Press [ON/OFF] to turn ON the machine, then remove any paper from the Auto Sheet Feeder.
- 2 Press [Maintenance] repeatedly until <b> appears.
- 3 Press [Black] or [Color].
- 4 Repeat steps 2 to 3 twice.
- **5** Open the Paper Output Tray.

# If an error occurs when the machine is connected to a computer

When an error occurs in printing such as the machine is out of paper or paper jams, a troubleshooting message is displayed automatically. Take the appropriate action described in the message.

The message may vary depending on the version of your Windows operating system.



# An Error Message Is Displayed On The LCD/LED

If an error message is displayed on the LCD or LED, take the corresponding countermeasure described below.



- If you cannot pull the paper out, turn the machine OFF and turn it back ON. The paper will be ejected automatically.

- If you have turned OFF the machine in step 1, you will need to retry printing, because this operation cancels any print jobs in progress.

If you cannot remove the paper or the paper tears inside the machine, or if the paper jam error continues after removing the paper, contact a Canon service representative.

# **Cannot Print Properly From The Digital Camera**

The following are the possible errors that may occur when printing directly from a digital still camera or digital video camcorder\*, and the countermeasures to eliminate them.

\*Hereafter, the digital still camera and digital video camcorder are collectively called a digital camera or camera.

#### ■ Note

- PictBridge compatible digital cameras can be connected to your machine for direct printing.
- This section describes errors that are indicated on Canon-brand PictBridge-compatible cameras. The error messages and operations may vary depending on the camera you are using. If you are using a non-Canon PictBridge compatible camera and not sure how to clear the error from the camera, confirm the message displayed on the LCD of the machine and clear the error. For clearing an error from the machine, see "An Error Message Is Displayed On The LCD/LED" on page 86.
- A communication time out occurs if printing takes a long time or if it takes too
  much time to send data. This may stop printing. In such cases, disconnect the
  cable between the machine and the camera, and reconnect the cable
  between the machine and the camera. Then, turn the camera on, if it does not
  automatically turn on. If the problem is still unresolved, select some other
  photo and check if it can be printed.
- Your PictBridge compatible device may need to be switched to printing mode before it is connected to the machine, depending on the model of the device. Also, it may need to be turned on manually or switched to replay mode after connected to the machine. Refer to the instruction manuals supplied with your camera and take the necessary steps before connection.
- The FINE Cartridge nozzles may be clogged if printing becomes faint or colors are incorrect. See "When Printing Becomes Faint Or Color Is Incorrect" on page 75.
- If the paper is curled or its surface is scratched during printing, make sure that you are using the correct type of paper.
- For the errors indicated on the camera and their solution, also refer to the user's manual of the camera. For other troubles with a digital camera, contact the manufacturer of the camera.

Error message on camera	Action
Printer in use/Printer warming up	Photos are printed from the computer.  Wait until printing ends. If the machine is warming up, wait until warm-up ends.
No paper/Paper error	Load paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder and press [OK] (MP180) / [Black] or [Color] (MP160) on the machine.
	If the Paper Output Tray is closed, open it. Printing is resumed.
Paper jam	Remove the jammed paper, load new paper, and press [OK] (MP180) / [Black] or [Color] (MP160) on the machine and retry printing.
Printer cover open	Close the Scanning Unit on the machine.
No print head	The FINE Cartridge may not be installed properly, or the Cartridge may not be the compatible with this machine. Install the appropriate FINE Cartridge. If lines are misaligned or the resulting output is not satisfactory, carry out the FINE Cartridge Alignment.

Error message on camera	Action

An error message appears and the ScanGear window fails to appear.	Reattaching the USB cable. Only use a certified USB 2.0 Hi-Speed cable.  Attach the USB cable to a different USB port on the computer itself (not a hub).  If a USB hub is used for the connection, do not use it. Inappropriate display settings.	Windows
	Set your display settings on your computer to Medium (16 bit) or higher.
	Macintosh
	In the [System Preferences] dialog, click the [Displays] icon and select the [Display] tab. Set the [Colors] list box to [Thousands] or a higher setting.
Dirty Platen Glass or Document Cover.	Clean the Platen Glass or the Document Cover of the machine, taking special care not to press strongly on the Platen Glass.
The status of the original is poor.	Scan with certain functions such as [Reduce Dust and Scratches], [Fading Correction] or [Grain Correction] in the Image Settings section of the Advanced Mode of ScanGear.

# ■ Parts Of Image Missing Or Surrounded By Extra White Areas

# ■ Error No.: 2001 Is Displayed

Cause	Action
A specified period of time has elapsed without receiving a response from the digital camera. /The digital camera or digital video camcorder connected is not compatible with this machine.	Disconnect the camera cable and reconnect the cable.  Depending on the model or brand of your device, you may have to select a print mode compliant with PictBridge before connecting the device.  You may also have to turn ON the device or select Play mode manually after connecting the device to the machine. Perform necessary operations according to the instruction manual supplied with your device.  If the error is still unresolved, there is a possibility that you are using a digital camera or digital video camcorder that is not supported by this machine. Use a digital cameras or digital video camcorder compatible with this machine.
